I must down to the seas again, for the call of the running tide Is a wild call and a clear call that may not be denied; And all I ask is a windy day with the white clouds flying, And the flung spray and the blown spume, and the sea-gulls crying.

I must down to the seas again to the vagrant gypsy life, To the gull's way and the whale's way where the wind's like a whetted knife; And all I ask is a merry yarn from a laughing fellow rover, And quiet sleep and a sweet dream when the long trick's over.

**Program Notes:** Sea Fever is from British poet and writer John Masefield's collected works entitled *Salt-Water Ballads.* The Poet Laurete loved and spent considerable time at sea which is evident in his brilliant imagery.

On this joyful Christmas Day sing fum, fum, fum. For a blessed Babe was born upon this day at the break of morn; In a manger poor and lowly lay the son of God most holy.

Give thanks to God this holy day; sing fum, fum, fum, Now all our voices raise and sing a song of grateful praise. Celebrate in song and story all the wonders of his glory.

Birds that live within the forest fum, fum, fum. All you fledgling leave behind and seek the Infant Savior kind. Build as well as you are able, down nest to be his cradle.

Praise we now the Lord above; sing fum, fum, fum. For upon this day at morn the wond'rous Son of God was born. In a manger poor and lowly lay the Blessed Babe most holy.

**Program Notes:** This carol is likely at least four hundred years old and there remains some discrepancy as to the meaning of the repeated word "fum" throughout. In Catalan "fum" means smoke, so it has been suggested that the carol continuously alludes to smoke seen rising from chimney's on Christmas Day.

## The Choir



The Grove City High School Men's Chorus is a non-audition concert choir that meets for twenty-five minutes in two different sections each day. The choir meets often after school to rehearse as a full group. They work for the highest standards in musicianship skills and challenge themselves with the repertoire they learn and perform. The group has been featured in concert with the Miami University Men's Glee Club, and Bowling Green State University Men's Chorus, and has been extended an invitation to perform with the Ohio State University Men's Glee Club in 2025 at their 150th anniversary concert. The choir has been invited to perform at the Ohio Music Education Association Professional Development Conference. They have consistently received superior ratings at district and state level OMEA adjudicated events in the highest classification.

Ann Johnson is the director of choral activities at Grove City High School. She received her Bachelor of Vocal Music Education from Ohio Wesleyan University and Master of Music Education and Kodaly Certification from The Kodaly Institute at Capital University. Her career has spanned many facets in and out of the classroom. She is an Adjudicator for the Ohio Music Education Association (OMEA) and serves on the Ohio Choral Directors Association (OCDA) Board.

The choirs and show choirs under the direction of Ms. Johnson have consistently received "Superior" ratings at regional and state level OMEA Adjudicated events and show choir competitions. Ms. Johnson has served as a Presider for the OMEA Professional Development Conference. She has served on the OMEA adjudicated events large group repertoire selection committee and ACDA National Adjudication panel. Choirs under her direction have been selected to perform at professional development conferences numerous times over the last few years. She made her conducting debut at Carnegie Hall in 2022 directing the top concert choirs at GCHS who were selected to perform a solo concert. She also spent a summer in a choral conductors seminar at the Juilliard School in New York City. Ann is an active adjudicator for show choir competitions around the country and directs two highly competitive show choirs in addition to four concert choirs at Grove City High School.

Brennan Harris, Accompanist/Assistant Director, received his M.M. in Choral Conducting from The Ohio State University.
